

OVERALL PHASE 1 PROGRAMMING OBJECTIVES



- Congregant emergency shelter space designed to operate 365 days a year for up to 100 adults (75 permanent beds, 25 hypothermia)
- Sleeping quarters for men and women, individual flex rooms, private space for overnight shelter employees
- Storage facilities for personal property
- Showers, bathrooms and guest laundry facilities
- Food preparation area & future commercial kitchen

- Dining Hall
- Lounge and Community Room
- Supply and donation storage
- Secure check-in and registration
- Private offices for shelter employees
- Professional offices, private meeting rooms and multipurpose rooms for use by other service providers
- Parking for employees, outside direct service providers and volunteers
- Enclosed outdoor recreation space

EXISTING SITE PLAN










SITE PLANNING DIAGRAM


- Separation of Guest and Staff Entry
- Maintain existing house entry as ceremonial entrance and volunteer entry
- Transition entry patio during secure intake process
- Central check-in and entrance lobby with visibility to guest and staff entrance
- Enclosed outdoor recreation area accessible from Multi-Purpose Room





PROPOSED SITE PLAN


- Demolition of large meeting room addition
- Reuse of existing house for secure staff and administration offices
- Two-story shelter addition to rear of existing house
- (30) On-site parking spaces for staff, volunteer and guest parking
- Bicycle racks





PROPOSED FLOOR PLANS

- Entrance lobby with visual connection to vestibule & exterior plaza; include distress alarm at desk; mailboxes for guests to be centrally located
- Access to guest laundry & personal belonging lockers
- Clean room with washer & dryer, cabinets and counter; bed-bug segregation area
- Additional storage for emergency overnight belongings
- Oversight to guest computer area; primary use for housing and job searches
- Multipurpose Room and Dining Area with seating for 80 guests; Provide vending, beverage station, microwave and food storage; Serves as emergency overflow and hypothermia housing
- Case Manager Offices and Conference Room
- Medical exam room for triage, small computer desk, under counter refrigerator
- Staff office areas including vault records storage and copy area; secure elevator access to second floor



PROPOSED FLOOR PLANS

- Women's Sleeping Rooms: (24) congregate living sleeping beds with underbed storage and locker per bed; (2) respite rooms for isolation as needed
- Men's Sleeping Rooms: (48) congregate living sleeping beds with underbed storage and locker per bed; (8) graduated sleeping areas; (3) respite rooms for isolation as needed
- (1) Floor manager private room per sleeping area
- Universal Sleeping Rooms: (4) individual living sleeping beds with underbed storage and locker per bed
- Use of low walls for privacy; provide durable wallcovering to prevent early wear
- Access to showers and toilets from each sleeping area
- Lounge with soft seating, table, chairs & TV
- Additional staff office areas including shared conference space, workroom and support spaces accessed from first floor secure office area of elevator corridor



- Affordable housing within the community






