Working smoke alarm helps three escape Kelley Street house fire

HARRISONBURG, Va. – The Harrisonburg Fire Department responded to a structure fire call Thursday morning, Aug. 3, in the 200 block of Kelley Street after three residents sleeping inside were alerted to a fire and able to escape thanks to a working smoke alarm in the home.

Five engines – four with HFD and one with Rockingham County Fire & Rescue – and one HFD ladder truck responded to the call. The first responding unit arrived within three minutes of the 9-1-1 call being received by the Harrisonburg-Rockingham Emergency Communications Center.

Arriving units found fire showing from the rear of the home and heavy smoke from all sides. Individuals who were home at the time were evaluated on the scene for smoke inhalation but were not injured. The Harrisonburg Rescue Squad assisted at the scene.

The Harrisonburg Fire Marshal's Office has determined the cause to be an accidental fire originating in the kitchen. Damages are estimated to be \$125,000.

In total, eight adults living in the home were displaced by the fire. The American Red Cross is working to assist the individuals with temporary housing at this time.
