## City seeks community feedback on North Main Street Sidewalk project

HARRISONBURG, Va. – The City of Harrisonburg is designing improvements along a stretch of North Main Street that will make travel safer by enhancing transportation options and filling gaps in existing sidewalk infrastructure.

Harrisonburg Public Works will host an open house Wednesday, Feb. 5, from 4 to 6 p.m. in the Lucy F. Simms Center Auditorium, 620 Simms Ave., where community members will learn about the project and have an opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback on proposed improvement designs.

The project will construct sidewalks on both sides of North Main Street, from Charles Street to Vine Street, to fill gaps between existing sidewalks. The road will be widened to

create bike lanes between Holly Hill Drive and Vine Street. Pedestrian signals, ramps and crosswalks will be installed at the intersection with Vine Street/Mt. Clinton Pike. The project is funded through the Virginia Department of Transportation SMART SCALE program.

The project enhances safe pedestrian access through intersection improvements, connecting sidewalk with existing sidewalk infrastructure, and the addition of bicycle lanes.

"We are excited to add more transportation options along this corridor and create uninterrupted sidewalk from Harrisonburg's north city limit to Downtown Harrisonburg," Harrisonburg Public Works Director Tom Hartman said. "We look forward to seeing these gaps filled and building facilities that allow our residents to travel to, or closer to, their destination safely."

Attendees of the open house will have the opportunity to:

- View educational displays about the improvement designs
- Speak directly with City staff about the project
- Express thoughts and questions through a public questionnaire that will be available during and after the event
